



Q267 - Q331 sixty-five cartridge cases

Results of examination:

The 65 cartridge cases, Q267 through Q331, were examined and two of them were found to be the same caliber as Oswald's rifle, Kl. It was determined, however, that these two cartridge cases could not have been fired in Oswald's rifle.
